NFHS INITIATES PROGRAM TO HELP SCHOOLS AFFECTED BY HURRICANES

High schools interested in helping schools affected by the recent disasters in Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas can adopt a school with a similar nickname through the Mascot Adoption Program (MAP) initiated by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS).

Schools across the United States are encouraged to initiate fund-raising efforts, or perhaps use donations from ticket proceeds, to provide funds for schools damaged or destroyed by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

"As the national organization for high school sports, we have received calls from schools across America wanting to help those affected by these disasters," said Robert F. Kanaby, NFHS Executive Director. "There has been a great outpouring of sympathy and concern, and I expect we will have many schools that will become involved in assisting those schools in the Gulf South that have suffered great losses."

The MAP program will be orchestrated through the NFHS Web site, www.nfhs.org. A list of the schools affected by these disasters has been posted, along with the nicknames of the schools. A total of 130 schools (92 in Louisiana and 38 in Mississippi) are included in the initial list. Schools interested in becoming involved with this fund-raising effort can find a school that has a similar nickname and choose to adopt that school by entering all the necessary information on the Web site.

When the sponsoring school completes its fund-raising activities, the school will send its contribution directly to the disaster-affected school in the Gulf South. "Once a school selects another school to adopt, we encourage the sponsoring school to publicize, within its student body and community, the names of the school and mascot it has adopted," Kanaby said.

"Schools helping schools, student-athletes and activity participants helping their counterparts, this is a great opportunity to help these schools and individuals that are in desperate need and provide a service leadership opportunity to all."

TRANSFER FORM INFORMATION

October is a busy time of year for processing domestic and non-domestic student eligibility forms, GE06 & GE07 (Transfer Forms) respectively, in the KHSAA office. A revised form GE06 for domestic students is enclosed. We would appreciate your assistance in helping with the transfer process so we can provide you with rulings in a timely manner:

- Review the transfer form and make sure it is completely filled out by the sending and receiving school (incomplete forms will be returned to the receiving school);
- Include an accurate enrollment date (postdated enrollment dates cannot be processed and will be returned to the receiving school);
- Do not use a Post Office Box for either the sending or receiving school address;
- If questions #1-#2 are checked "NO" (student has never played in a varsity contest in any sport), the transfer form does not need to be sent to the KHSAA for processing. It should, however, be kept on file at the school;
- Inform parents that all communications regarding the transfer status should be with the member school (NOT the KHSAA);
- Faxed or hand delivered transfers are not accepted;
- In the case of a change in residence please include documentation of the disposal of the previous residence. Appropriate documents include a bill of sale, sales contracts, purchase agreements. This information will be requested if not automatically included with the form:
- If there has been a change of custody, please include a signed copy of the court ordered documents with the transfer;
- No athletic participation for one school year at the sending school is a new condition for a waiver effective for the 2005-06 school year. The sending school should verify this on the form;
- Allow one week from the date you mail the form to the KHSAA before calling the office to check on the status (school personnel will receive priority);
