Both selected board members and the staff have received feedback from specific coaches about the need to have carts as an option for the state first round and state tournaments specifically for coaches.

Thus far, no workable solution has been proposed. This issue is one of the constant points when state staff managing golf meet at the NFHS Summer Meeting. For the most part, all states cite issues around cart availability, management of the rental of the carts, possible liability issues, changes due to inclement weather, additional carts required by Federal law around ADA and other concerns. Coaches cite the need to get around to multiple players who are not grouped together.

Options should be discussed with the idea that those requesting the allowance come forward with at least the start of a workable solution. Considerations must be:

- Cart availability and schools being required to fund the rental of any cart not available at the course on a daily basis
- Does this impact the future hosts due to many perhaps not being able to meet a new requirement?
- Management of the rental process
- □ Cancellation policies for non-qualifiers
- □ Weather cancellation or cart use alteration for October events
- □ And others that may be identified through discussion
