### STATE SWIMMING/DIVING THIS WEEKEND

The 56<sup>th</sup> KHSAA Swimming & Diving State Meet is scheduled for this Friday and Saturday, Feb. 23-24, at the University of Kentucky's Lancaster Aquatics Center in Lexington.

Friday's Preliminary competition begins at 10:15 a.m., with doors opening for warm-ups at 7:15 a.m. For Saturday's finals, doors open at 8 a.m., with competition beginning at 11 a.m.

General Admission is \$5 per day. Children under 6 will be admitted free.

Friday's preliminary entries are posted on the KHSAA website. Results from both days will also be available on the website.

Defending champions St. Xavier (boys) and Sacred Heart (girls) each won their regional competition and look to repeat as State Champion. St. Xavier has captured the last 12 boys' state titles and 13 of the last 14. The Tigers have 36 titles, which rank second in the nation for overall titles. Honolulu Punahou (HI) holds the record with 39.

Sacred Heart has an impressive streak of titles to its credit as well. The Valkyries own six consecutive girls' titles and have won 17 of the last 23. Overall, SHA has 19 girls' championships, ranking tied for fifth in the nation for overall titles. Punahou (HI) also holds the girls' record with 40.

### ST. XAVIER CAPTURES STATE WRESTLING TITLE

St. Xavier, after finishing runner-up last year to Woodford County by just 2.5 points, picked up its second State Wrestling title in the last four years at the 38<sup>th</sup> KHSAA State Wrestling Championships held Friday and Saturday in Farnham Dudgeon Civic Center in Frankfort.

The Tigers, boasting a qualifier in each of the 14 weight classes, finished with 158.5 points. The mark was the eight-highest ever recorded at the State Championships and just 2.5 points behind the mark the team scored en route to the 1998 title.

LaRue County was second at 124, while last year's champion Woodford County finished third at 120.

Sheldon Clark picked up the most individual titles with three (Derrick Mollette-145; Josh Muncy-189; John Dials-215). St. Xavier had two individual champions (Isaac Knable-140; Zack Steinbrock-152) as well as Woodford County (Tyler

Baldwin-112; Eric Slugantz-171). Knable was named Outstanding Wrestler.

## **BOYS' BASKETBALL NOTES**

Caldwell County's Dustin Cash broke Michael Fraliex's school record of nine three-pointers made set in 1992 with 10 in a recent win over Providence. In the contest, Cash "cashed" in for a career-high 48 points.

Caverna's C.C. Woodard has posted 10 double-doubles (points/rebounds) in 21 games on the year. He leads the team in scoring at 18.6 ppg. and rebounding at 9.1 rpg.

Central Hardin connected on a school-record 13 three-point field goals in a recent win over Bardstown. The effort eclipsed the previous school record of 11 made last year against Caverna.

Christian Academy's Josh Pittman had a big recent threegame stretch. In wins over Highview Baptist, Evangel and Portland Christian, Pittman connected on 11 of 20 threepoint attempts and 13 of 23 attempts inside the arc for 56% in scoring 85 points during the run.

Cumberland County's Patrick Hamilton had a pair of back-to-back impressive games. Hamilton scored 44 points in a 76-72 win over Allen Co.-Scottsville and then followed the performance with a 37-point effort in a 75-66 win over Adair County.

Fairdale coach Lloyd Gardner picked up his 200<sup>th</sup> career win in the Bulldogs' 76-59 win over Waggener last Tuesday. In his 10<sup>th</sup> season, Gardner has a 200-96 record.

Holy Cross (Covington) had two career-high performances last week. Jason Hinzman poured in 20 points last Tuesday against Newport while Ray Arlinghaus had 29 points against Lloyd Memorial.

June Buchanan's Zack Bentley posted his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point last Tuesday in a game against Breathitt County. He is only the sixth player in the 17-year history of the Crusaders' program to accomplish the feat.

Madisonville-North Hopkins star Michael Haney continues to post strong numbers. Haney posted a double-double in an 87-56 win over Lyon County last Tuesday. He had 28 points, 20 rebounds, 6 assists, 3 blocks, 3 steals. Haney connected on 12 of 16 field goals and was 4-for-4 from the free throw line.

Marshall County's Aaron Lyles became just the ninth player in school history to score 1,000 points in a recent win over Fulton County.

Pikeville's Chase Gibson scored his 2,000<sup>th</sup> career point in a recent game against Pike Co. Central. Gibson is only the second player in school history to score 2,000 points and grab 1,000 rebounds. The only other was Dickie Prater who played from 1948-50. Gibson stands third on the school's all-time scoring list, trailing only Prater and Mark Myers.

South Laurel's Richie Riley set a school record with 16 assists in a recent game against Whitley County. His effort ranks tied for fourth among state records.

Berea is enjoying a successful year. Through 24 games, the Pirates had held opponents to just 36.1% from the field en route to a 15-9 record.

## **GIRLS' BASKETBALL NOTES**

Belfry attempted a state-record 72 free throws in a 91-82 win over Johnson Central last Monday. The Lady Pirates were 50 of 72 from the line while Johnson Central was 19 of 30. Belfry's 50 free throws made was also a state record.

Boone County's Ciara Henderson had a strong outing in a recent win over defending region champion Highlands. Henderson was 4-of-5 from beyond the three-point arc and connected on all six of her free throws to tally 22 points. She also had 10 rebounds, an assist and a steal in the 58-32 win for the Rebels.

Estill County's Jessica Puckett scored her 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point in a game last Monday against Madison Southern.

At 21-4, two-time defending 11<sup>th</sup> Region champ Lexington Catholic has surpassed the 20 wins mark for the fifth consecutive year. Second-year coach Greg Todd has now had nine consecutive 20-plus coaching wins seasons.

Mercer County's lone senior Allison Pearson posted her 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point with a 22-point effort in an 89-40 win over Burgin last Monday. Pearson is one of only seven girls to accomplish the feat for the Scotties. In the same game, freshman Courtney Watts set a school mark with 15 assists.

Kristi Porter has become the first player to score 1,000 points and pull down 1,000 rebounds for Muhlenberg South.

Adair County's Samantha Grider has become the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,422 career points.

Pikeville's Jill Kimberlain recently surpassed 2,000 career points.

Jessie Rickels of Rockcastle County recently scored her 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point.

Russell's Samantha Nester, a freshman, scored her  $1,000^{th}$  career point last Monday in a game against Morgan County.

Scott's Amanda Matracia and Colleen Pairan are making it difficult for opponents to get off shots. Matracia set a school record with 11 blocks last Monday against Boone County. Pairan has 60 blocks on the year and tied the school record with 285 career blocks.

Jessica Schmidt became Walton-Verona's all-time leading scorer in last Thursday's win over Pendleton County. Schmidt had 28 points and 25 rebounds. She has 2,128 points, surpassing Sharri Clinkenbeard's mark of 2,103.

Wolfe County's Jessica Dunn enjoyed a stellar game in last Monday's win over Letcher. Dunn had 38 points, 8 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 assists. She hit on 12-of-16 from the field and 4-of-6 from beyond the three-point arc.
