GIRLS' BASKETBALL NOTES

Allyson Dockery of Highview Baptist had 21 rebounds in a 58-53 loss to Moore back on Jan. 8. Dockery leads the squad on the year with 129 rebounds in 14 games (9.2 rpg.).

Sacred Heart's Donna Moir picked up career win No. 200 in a 74-33 win over Oldham County back on Jan. 9.

Marshall County coach Howard Beth continues to close in on career win No. 600. In his 24th season, Coach Beth's career coaching record stands at 596-87 with a current 11-3 record on the year. The Lady Marshals improved to 11-3 after avenging an earlier season defeat with a 50-34 win on the road at Calloway County. Beth is the state's leader for girls' career coaching wins and one of just two coaches to eclipse 500 career wins. Bill Goller of Holy Cross (Covington) is the other with 512 career wins.

BOYS' BASKETBALL NOTES

St. Mary star Ryan Cochran recently posted his 2,000th career point. Through 13 games this season, Cochran has 340 points (26.1 ppg.) on the year and 2,058 for his career. He is now just 150 points shy of the school record held by Gene Roof.

Kevin Bridgewater of Adair County was 23 of 37 from the field, including six of 13 from beyond the three-point arc and connected on nine of 11 free throw attempts in two games last week for a total of 61 points to help the Indians to wins over Green County (85-67) and Monroe County (71-53).

Cornerstone Christian set a new school record with 29 assists last Monday in an 80-42 win over Holy Angels. Jason Diehl handed out 14 of those while Zack Myatt led the squad on the boards with 15 rebounds.

DELEGATE ASSEMBLY VOTING

Voting results from last Wednesday's Annual Delegate Assembly Meeting may be viewed by logging on to the KHSAA website at www.khsaa.org. Proposals needed a two-thirds vote (152 affirmative votes) to pass. Seven of 11 proposals passed. Among those were a proposal to allow schools 11 weeks to play a 10-game schedule and a proposal to separate the Indoor/Outdoor Track seasons. Among those defeated was a proposal to add two members to the KHSAA Board of Control with those members coming from non-public member schools.

HYPE STUDENT LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

A total of 384 students attended the KHSAA's first annual HYPE Student Leadership / Sportsmanship Conference, sponsored by the Kentucky Bankers Association, in conjunction with the Annual Meeting last Wednesday. The group totaled 451 including adults and began the conference with its opening general session in Rupp Arena. Former Scott County, Purdue University and current WNBA star Ukari Figgs addressed the group in Rupp. Mr. Harvey Alston of Ohio addressed a joint session of the two meetings later in the day at the Radisson Plaza Hotel.

Plans for next year's conference are underway, with the event to take place on a separate day from the Annual Meeting.
