LAWRENCE COUNTY'S WEST ON THE LOOSE

With 130 yards rushing in Lawrence County's 26-20 overtime win over Belfry, Michael West surpassed Madisonville's Sonny Collins (6,200, 1968-71) for the ninth spot among the state's career rushing leaders with 6,270. Derek Homer of Fort Knox holds the state record with 8,224 yards from 1993-96. Only four players have rushed for 7,000-plus career yards. Homer is the lone rusher with 8,000-plus yards in state history. Following is a breakdown of West's figures.

FOOTBALL NOTES FROM WEEK#3

Jason Foley ran eight times for 133 yards and two touchdowns in helping **Russell County** to a 57-0 win over McCreary Central. Teammate **Anthony Jasper** caught two passes for 52 yards and two touchdowns. **Lee Holt** has 27 tackles in just two games for the Lakers. On the year, Russell County has allowed just 125 yards on offense and six points.

Scott County punter **Nick Cyrus** is averaging 40 yards-per-punt for the Cardinals through two games. **Jayce Johnson** had an 83-yard interception return for a score in the Cardinals 41-21 win over George Rogers Clark. For **GRC, Mark Christopher** completed 23 of 44 passes for 320 yards and two touchdowns.

Letiz Arnold ran 20 times for 245 yards and three touchdowns in helping **Ballard Memorial** to a 39-0 win over Reidland. **Lawrence Arnold** ran twice for 98 yards and two touchdowns in the contest. He also had three receptions for 115 yards and another score in helping the Bombers improve to 3-0 on the year.

Lexington Catholic's Tripp Eckerline saw his state-record consecutive PAT string come to an end earlier this season. Eckerline connected on 70 consecutive before having the streak snapped two weeks ago against Corbin. Teammate **Jacob Doss** has completed a pass for a touchdown in 15 consecutive games for the Knights. That streak is the seventh longest in state history. Leslie County's Tim Couch holds the state record for consecutive games with a touchdown pass completion with 30 from 1993-95.

Bullitt East's Landon Collins connected on a whopping 10 PATs as East rolled to an 86-0 win over Bullitt Central. The 86 points by East was a school record for points in a contest.

Pleasure Ridge Park's Matt Bruederle ran just three times but amassed 117 yards and scored two touchdowns in helping the Panthers to a 48-8 win over Iroquois.

Two-time defending Eight-Player State Champion **Eminence** saw its 23-game winning streak, the state's second longest active winning streak at the time, come to an end with a 32-14 loss to Carroll County.

Christian Academy-Louisville racked up 376 yards rushing en route to a 47-0 win over Bethlehem. **Jonathan Brough** returned an interception 60 yards for a score for the Centurions.

Larry Hay was named "MVP" of the Henderson County Hall of Fame Bowl last Friday. Hay scored on touchdown runs of 50, six and one yards and completed a 28-yard touchdown pass in a 63-0 win over Daviess County. Hay also recovered a fumble in the contest for the Colonels. Tanner Siewert set two school records back on Aug. 24. Siewert booted a school-record 47-yard field goal and connected on two additional 40-yard kicks. His three field goals in the game set a new school record for field goals in a game.

Eric Moore has been running wild for **Holy Cross (Louisville)**. Moore ran 40 times for 251 yards and three touchdowns in a 24-0 win over DeSales. A week earlier, he ran 30 times for 215 yards and 5 touchdowns against Shawnee.

Fort Campbell gave new **Coach Ronnie Bell** his first win with a 43-0 victory over Fulton County. The Falcons' offense ran 42 times for 440 yards while holding Fulton County to just 81 yards on the ground.

Bowling Green's Adam Mercer now holds the school record for consecutive PATs with 28. Mercer kicked the school's second-longest field goal in history with a 45-yard kick in Bowling Green's 41-0 win over Greenwood last week.

Defending Class AAAA State Champion **Male** improved to 3-0 with a 50-10 win over Seneca. **Brandon Blackerby** completed 10 of 13 passes, including three for touchdowns. **Chris Barclay** hauled in five receptions for 67 yards and two touchdowns, as **Coach Bob Red**man became Jefferson County's all-time leader in career coaching wins with 226. Redman surpassed William Kean of Central.

Kentucky Country Day's Matt Endy is averaging 139.5 yards rushing and 108.5 yards passing in helping KCD to a 2-0 start on the season.

In eight kicks, Fern Creek punter Eric Boley is averaging 39.5 yards-per-punt on the season.

Brian Dodd ran eight times for 129 yards in helping **Hopkinsville** to a 47-24 win over Mayfield. Dodd scored on runs of 13 and 86 yards and returned a kickoff 91 yards for a touchdown. On defense, Dodd picked off an interception, caused two pass breakups, and had two tackles.
