Lindsey Mills of Beth Haven connected on seven of 12 three point shots in a 72-34 win over Whitefield Academy last Saturday.

Henderson County's 88-58 win over Hopkins County Central last week gave the program its 23<sup>rd</sup> win of the regular season, breaking the school mark for regular season wins of 22 set by the 1993-94 team.

Chaz Bargo of Knox Central is averaging a double-double on the season for the Panthers. He is averaging 16.9 ppg. and pulling down 11.6 rpg. In addition, Bargo is shooting 88.9% from the free throw line (96/108). Kris Mills leads the team in scoring with a 21.2 average. Mills had scorched the nets for 30-plus points on six occasions this year.

Ludlow's boys' basketball team has set a new school record for wins in a season with 25. The old mark was 22, set by the 1983-84 squad.
