### JEFFERSONTOWN BOYS' BASKETBALL COACH PENALIZED

Jeffersontown boys' basketball coach Jeff Morrow has been penalized for violation of KHSAA Bylaw 10 (Recruitment). Morrow made improper contact with an athlete that was a student at another school that subsequently enrolled at Jeffersontown High School.

Morrow was reprimanded and is suspended from coaching for four games (1/29 vs. Central Hardin; 2/5 vs. Nelson Co.; 2/8 vs. Ballard; 2/12 vs. DuPont Manual). In addition, the boys' basketball program is placed on probation for the remainder of the 2007-2008 year and on probation for the 2008-09.

### NATIONAL CITY TROPHY TOUR KICKS OFF

For the fifth consecutive year, National City as title sponsor of the Boys' Sweet 16® State Basketball Tournament will again tour the championship trophy at selected games.

On the tour, students are able to pick up scholarship application forms on each stop (forms may also be accessed through the KHSAA website). Again this year, 16 boys and 16 girls (one boy and one girl from each region) will receive a one-time \$1,000 scholarship courtesy of National City.

Scholarship recipients will be honored with a reception prior to the Championship game of the National City/KHSAA Boys' Sweet 16® as well as being recognized on the floor during the contest. ## BASKETBALL TICKETS

Tickets to the 2008 National City/KHSAA Boys' and Houchens/KHSAA Girls' State Basketball Tournaments continue to be on sale through the KHSAA office and online at khsaa.org. At this time, only full tournament sets of tickets (one ticket to each of the eight sessions) are available. Lower arena seats are priced at \$116 each and upper arena seats are priced at \$66 each. Tickets will be on sale through the KHSAA until Feb. 22. Beginning March 2, tickets will only be available through the Rupp Arena (boys) and Diddle Arena (girls) box offices and/or the venue's respective online ticketing agent.
