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Board of Control Meeting - March 15, 1946

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the Kentucky Hotel, Louisville, on Friday morning, March 15, 1946, at 9:00 o'clock, with all members present except the secretary.

The minutes of the February 22-23 meeting of the board were read and approved. Coach Arthur Mullins of Elkhorn City (Cumberland H. S. at Praise) met before the Board to explain his management of the tournament in District 57. After hearing Mr. Mullins' statements, the Board continued the case and adjourned to meet the following day at 9:00 a.m.

All members of the Board were present at the March 16 meeting. Supt. C. A. Hollowell of Marion appeared before the Board in connection with the Billy Reeder case. Mr. Hollowell presented original records of enrollment and attendance of Billy Reeder during the spring semester of 1945.

Coach Charles A. Davis of Benham, Coach Walter Mauk of Carrollton, former coach of Benham, and Coach James M. Taylor of Bell County, appeared before the Board to discuss the controversy over the Benham-Bell County football contract.

Mr. Dan Chesnut and Coach Z. R. Howard of Lynn Camp appeared before the Board to discuss the disturbance following the Lynn Camp-Williamsburg game in the 50th district tournament.

The following school officials appeared before the Board to give testimony concerning the controversy growing out of the London-Hazel Green game in the 48th district tournament: Coach Holbert Hodges of London, Principal J. B. Parsley and Coach Virgil McWhorter of Hazel Green, Coach D. P. Parsley of East Bernstadt, Principal C. Frank Bentley of Bush, and County Superintendent Curtis McDaniel of Laurel County. It was claimed that referee Abney had been struck by the brother of a London player.

Principal Farley and Coach Doan of Belfry appeared before the Board to give testimony in the 57th district tournament management controversy,

There was a discussion of the Billy Reeder case. No new evidence was presented which warranted a change in the previous decision of the Board. Mr. Chumbler, who had been summoned to appear before the Board in connection with the protest, failed to appear.

Walter Jetton moved, seconded by Russell Williamson that the football contract between Benham and Bell County be declared void since it appears that the signature of C. M. Mathis is not his own, and the contract is, in the opinion of the Board, not enforceable. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Lynn Camp case, the London - Hazel Green- Laurel Co. controversy, and the Elkhorn City-Belfry cases were deferred until the next meeting of the Board.

Russell Williamson moved, seconded by C. T. Ward, that all bills as recorded and read by the secretary for the period beginning February 22, 1946 and ending March 14, 1946, be allowed. The motion was carried unanimously.


