Kentucky High School Athletic Association East Eligibility Committee Meeting August 29, 1989

The East Eligibility Hearing Committee met at the Kentucky High Sch, Athletic Association Office Building on Tuesday, August 29, 1989, for purpose of hearing three eligibility cases. Members present were: Chairman, Pearl Ray LeFevers, Alvis Johnson, David Points, Jack Portwood Marvin Moore and Liz Trabandt. Commissioner Tom Mills and Executive Assistant Billy V. Wise were also in attendance.

The first case was presented by Mr. Al Johnson and his son Craig who appeared before the Committee to appeal the ruling of the Commissioner following Craig's transfer from Lexington Catholic High School to Henr Clay High School.

Following Mr. Johnson's presentation, questions by members of the Committee, and a lengthy discussion thereof, the Committee voted to up the ruling of the Commissioner in this case. Therefore, Craig remains ineligible to represent Henry Clay High School in interscholastic athletics until he has been enrolled there for a period of thirty-six school weeks.

It was the finding of the Committee that Craig had attended Lexington Catholic High School as a freshman and sophomore and then changed schools. It was determined he did not qualify for a waiver of the transfer rule under any of the provisions provided within the rules.

Mr. Timothy P. Frodge then appeared before the Committee to appeal ruling of the Commissioner in the case of the son, Bryan, who transfers to Simon Kenton High School from St. Henry High School.

Following the presentation by Mr. Frodge and a discussion thereof, Committee voted to uphold the ruling of the Commissioner in this case. Therefore, Bryan remains ineligible to represent Simon Kenton High School in interscholastic althetics until he has been enrolled there for a periof thirty-six school weeks.

The discussion of the Committee was based upon the fact that Bryan attended St. Henry High School for a period of three years and then changed schools. The Committee determined that Bryan did not qualify a waiver of the transfer rule under any of the provisions provided with the rule.

Mr. Ernie Sacra appeared before the Committee, accompanied by his Matthew, and Principal Ken Cox of Tates Creek High School. Mr. Sacra present to appeal the ruling of the Commissioner following Matthew's transfer from Bradenton High School in Brandenton, Florida.

Following Mr. Sacra's presentation, questions to him, Matthew and Mr. Cox, the Committee voted to uphold the ruling of the Commissioner in this case. Therefore, Matthew remains ineligible to represent Tates Creek High School in interscholastic athletics for a period of thirty-six school weeks.

The decision of the Committee was based upon the fact that Matthew attended Brandenton High School during the 1988-89 school year and then transferred to Tates Creek High School. Matthew does not qualify for a waiver of the transfer rule under any of the provision provided within the rule.
